AMENDED CERTIFICATION OF REPRESENTATIVES

Pursuant to a Consent Election by and between the **State of Rhode Island - Department of Behavioral Healthcare, Developmental Disabilities & Hospitals** and **RI Council 94, AFSCME, AFL-CIO, Local 2883** and RIASSE, LOCAL 580, SEIU, AFL-CIO, the Rhode Island State Labor Relations Board held an election on February 17, 1978, by secret ballot of: All supervisory employees in the following appropriation accounts, not presently included in any bargaining unit: 1010; 1030; 1033; 1040; 1041; 1042; 1050; 1053; 1060; 1061; 1062; 1068; 1069; 1081; 1082; 1083; 1084; 1090; 6810 (414, 416, 418). See attached sheet, which contains names and supervisory positions agreed upon to be appropriate for this unit.

On the basis of the election of said employees as aforesaid, **RI Council 94, AFSCME, AFL-CIO, Local 2883** has been designated by a majority of said employees of the **State of Rhode Island – Department of Behavioral Healthcare, Developmental Disabilities & Hospitals**, as their bargaining representative.

That on April 15, 2020, a request was received from RISEA-Council 22, AFSCME, AFL-CIO (**RI Council 94, AFSCME, AFL-CIO**) that the above-entitled certification be amended to reflect the identity change of the party’s representatives.

That on May 19, 2020, after review and discussion, the RI State Labor Relations Board accepted the request for amendment to this certification, reflecting the identity change of the party’s representatives, to read: **State of Rhode Island – Department of Behavioral Healthcare, Developmental Disabilities & Hospitals** and **RI Council 94, AFSCME, AFL-CIO, Local 2883** and RIASSE, LOCAL 580, SEIU, AFL-CIO.

THEREFORE, the Rhode Island State Labor Relations Board by virtue of and pursuant to the powers vested in said Board by Section 28-7-16, of the General Laws of Rhode Island, 1956, entitled State Labor Relations Act, it is hereby:
