## ORDER

This case was presented to the duty justice on a motion for stay filed by the Warwick School Committee in aid of a petition for certiorari which seeks review of a judgment entered in the Superior Court affirming a decision of the State Labor Relations Board. In essence this decision as affirmed by the Superior Court requires the Warwick School Committee to place into effect the terms and conditions of the 1988-1991 contract between the School Committee and the Warwick Teachers Union.

After examining the petition for certiorari, the memoranda filed in support thereof, the memoranda in support of the motion for stay and the objections and memoranda filed by the Warwick Teachers Union, the duty justice enters the following order:

- 1. The motion for stay is hereby denied
- 2. Counsel for the Warwick School Committee may have a period of ten (10) days in which to file a supplemental memoranda to the petition for certiorari and/or memorandum in support thereof. Thereafter, counsel for the Warwick Teachers Union may have a further five (5) days in which to respond to any amendment or modification filed by the School

Committee. Counsel for the Labor Board may have a period of five (5) days from and after the filing of the School Committee's modification in order to respond thereto.

- 3. The School Committee's request for stay will be presented to the court at its session in conference at which it considers the issuance of a writ of certiorari.
- 4. The court will consider the petition for certiorari and the motion for stay in aid thereof at its first conference following the filing of the last memoranda permitted by this order.
